

Father Tolton raises money for parish with visit to Holy Family Parish in Chicago

When Father Tolton came to Chicago and was put in charge of the Black Catholic community in the city, one of his first plans was to build a church for their own. St. Monica's.

As with construction of any new church, but especially for one where the congregation was largely poor, raising money for construction was difficult.

Father Tolton arranged fairs for the church and any other efforts he and his flock could think of to raise money but he also took his appeal to neighboring parishes. One of those was Holy Family Church on Roosevelt Road, which at the time was staffed by the Jesuits.

Recently while compiling a history of their high school, St. Ignatius College Prep, located next door to Holy Family Church, the Jesuits uncovered evidence of a visit by Father Tolton in 1893. He preached at all of the Masses and received \$500 in donations for St. Monica's. That translated into almost \$15,000 in 2019.

Father Tolton also accepted appeals to speak around the country in order to raise money for his flock. As soon as he returned from Rome to Quincy the appeals came in but he frequently turned them down in order to be with his congregation.

In a letter to Josephite Father John Slattery, rector of St. Joseph Seminary for Colored Missions in Baltimore, he wished for "27 Father Toltons or colored priests" who could meet the number of requests from around the country to visit and lecture. It would have been "a grand thing," he said, to be a traveling missionary ministering to black Catholics around the country.

That was not where God placed him, however. Instead he was focused on the 270 souls from 400 families in Chicago. He wrote of turning down lectures because he was trying to gather more people for his parish "for these poor people here who had been left in a bag with both ends open if I must say it and the Irish bishop has given them all up to me."
